

2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships 19th June – 21st June 2025, Setubal, Portugal SELECTION POLICY

1. **POLICY PURPOSE**

1.1. This selection policy outlines the process for selecting the team to represent Great Britain at the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Swimming Championships in Setubal, Portugal, 19th -21st June 2025.

2. PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

2.1. The target for the event is to provide a meaningful competitive opportunity in the long-term development of British junior swimmers towards future senior international success.

3. TEAM SIZE

- 3.1. Up to four (4) swimmers may be selected, subject to available funding, for the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships. The total number of swimmers selected will be at the discretion of the Performance Director. There is no obligation to use select four (4) swimmers.
- 3.2. Swimmers based overseas (outside of the United Kingdom) should take specific note of Clause 7.1 and of the General Conditions of this policy, with specific reference to clauses G3, G8 and G9.

4. **SELECTION PROCESS**

- 4.1. Selections will be made from performances in the 1500m freestyle event at the 2025 Aquatics GB Swimming Championships, London Aquatics Centre, London, 15th 20th April 2025 ("the British Championships").
- 4.2. In the event that the 2025 British Championships is cancelled, a revised selection policy will be published by the Aquatics GB Swimming Leadership Team.

5. **AGE ELIGIBILITY**

5.1 Athletes born 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011

6. ATHLETE SELECTION

6.1. The fastest two male and fastest two female swimmers in the 1500m freestyle at the 2025 British Championships from those age eligible will be invited for selection subject to achieving the minimum consideration time in Table 1.

- 6.2 If any of the two male and/or two female swimmers decline their selection invite, the selection panel may consider inviting other swimmers who achieve the minimum consideration time at the British Championships. All male and female swimmers achieving the minimum consideration time at the British Championships will be ranked against this and selection invites prioritised to the next fastest swimmers.
- 6.3 If two male and/or two female swimmers are not selected, the panel reserves the right to select athletes of any gender up to the maximum team size providing swimmers have achieved the minimum consideration time at the British Championships.
- 6.4 Any eligible swimmer achieving selection for the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Championships (pool) or the 2025 World Aquatics Championships (pool or Open Water) will not be considered for selection.

7. TEAM ASSEMBLY

7.1 All selected swimmers will be required to cover their own travel expenses to the designated assembly point in the UK for travel to the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships.

8. ANNOUNCEMENT

8.1. The 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships Team will be announced on, or before Monday 28th April 2025.

SELECTION POLICY GENERAL CONDITIONS

ELIGIBILITY

Swimmers must:

- G1 Be a British citizen and eligible to represent Great Britain as per World Aquatics rules.
- G2 Have completed a Selection Acceptance Form to confirm they will be available to participate by the deadline to be imposed by Aquatics GB. Failure to do so will be interpreted as non-availability by Aquatics GB. Selection Acceptance Forms will be provided by Aquatics GB to qualifying team members.
- G3 Be available to fulfil all team commitments from the time of selection through to the Championships.
- G4 Comply with any other World Aquatics eligibility criteria from time to time, including in respect of nationality and/or anti-doping.

TEAM COMMITMENTS

All Team members will be required to:

- G5 Comply with the Aquatics GB Code of Conduct. A breach of the Aquatics GB Code of Conduct may result in de-selection from the team.
- G6 Adhere to all prescribed travel arrangements which might involve different travel dates to other members of the team.
- G7 Abide by media protocols of the Aquatics GB Programme. Athletes must only speak to the media about their own performances and group coaches must only comment on performances of swimmers in their group. The GB Head Coach and Performance Director may discuss performances of the entire team. Swimmers must not publicise any information in relation selection-related matters until authorised to do so by the Team Leader.
- G8 Not take holiday or attend overseas camps and/or competitions between the selection trials and the meet for which they have been selected without prior written approval from the Performance Director.
- G9 Make themselves available for all team activities designated by the GB Head Coach (including but not limited to preparation camps and staging camps). No team member will be allowed to leave a national team camp or undertake any activities that are not directly relevant to the team camp programme; this includes any external media, sponsor or social activities. Failure to attend the required activities could result in withdrawal from the team. Under exceptional circumstances, written approval to be excluded from activities may be given by the Performance Director.
- G10 Comply with Aquatics GB and World Aquatics swimwear regulations whilst competing at the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships.

WITHDRAWALS AND REPLACEMENTS

G11 If for any reason a swimmer is unable or unwilling to fully comply with the Team Commitments (G5 to G10) they may be withdrawn from the team.

G12 Swimmers becoming unfit due to illness or injury (physical or mental) at any time following their selection must notify Aquatics GB immediately and will be required to undertake a full medical examination which <u>may</u> result in the swimmer being de-selected from the team at the complete discretion of the GB Head Coach. In the event of injury or illness athletes may be deselected if they pose a risk to themselves, other athletes or team staff as determined by the Aquatics GB Chief Medical Officer or her designate.

REPLACEMENTS

G13 Replacement of swimmers withdrawn from the team will be considered at the complete discretion of the GB Head Coach in the best interest of the overall team performance.

OTHER

- G14 The World Class Programme Swimming Leadership Team may amend selection policies, within reason at its discretion.
- G15 The Performance Director and GB Head Coach will exercise their authority to ensure that the final selections for the 2025 European Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships team are in line with this policy and will result in the best possible achievements at the Championships.

APPEALS

G16 Any appeals against non-selection must be made to Aquatics GB in accordance with the aquatics GB Team Selection Appeals Procedures, available online at https://www.britishswimming.org/performance/swimming/selection-policies/team-selection-appeals/ or by request from Adam Clarke, Associate Director via email at adam.clarke@aquaticsgb.com. Athletes should be aware of the time limits contained in the Procedures, which are designed with the intention of resolving issues expeditiously and fairly.
