



DRY DIVE LAYOUT



























VENUE LAYOUT

TECHNICAL MEETING

The technical meeting will take place at 17:00 on Thursday 29th January in the Diving Officials Room.

DIVE SHEETS

Divers/Coaches are requested to submit dive sheets electronically, both for their own convenience and to minimize the chance of errors loading the data into the Recording program. Coaches may make bulk submission of dive sheets on behalf of their divers by using the program DiveSheets with which they will already be familiar. Alternatively, individual divers may submit their own dive sheets on-line.. To submit your dive sheets on-line there are two options:

- Either visit: www.diverecorder.co.uk/onlinesheets and follow the instructions, or
- If you have an Android phone or tablet, you can get the ADiveSheets app from this page on the DiveRecorder website: www.diverecorder.co.uk/dive/android

As soon as you complete either on-line submission method, you will see a success/failure message.

Electronic dive sheets must be submitted. Electronic submissions must be made <u>9am Wednesday 29th January</u>. You will be asked to sign hard copies of these sheets at the venue, available from the Recorders.

If manual dive sheets need to be submitted, submissions must be made by 2 hours before the Technical Meeting.

REGISTRATION / MEMBERSHIP DEADLINE

Divers should be registered with their respective Home Nation Governing Body 60 days prior to the commencement of the National Event ("The Meet") for which the diver is entering.

International divers must be a member of their country's diving federation in order to enter.























EVENT CONDITIONS

Event Conditions for AGB Diving International 2026

1. EVENT FORMAT

The AGB Diving International Event will be held in accordance with the World Aguatics Rules which can be found on the WA website https://www.worldaquatics.com/rules/competition-regulations

2. COMPETITION FORMAT

- The AGB Diving International shall be open to all World Aquatics affiliated Federations
- In the preliminary stage of the individual events there is no limit to the number of entries from any federation.
- The top twelve (12) placed divers from the preliminary round will progress from preliminary to final.
- Only two (2) divers from any federation will be permitted to qualify for the final. Any places in the final, not taken up by top 2 divers per federation will be allocated to the next diver in the rankings from the preliminary round.
- The synchronised competitions will have a direct final. There is no limit on the number of entries from any federation, but only one synchro pair from each federation will be on the victory podium.
- There is no opportunity for exhibition places.

2.1 Judges

- The Event shall be judged by World Aquatics Bronze, Silver or Gold judges on the World Aquatics Diving Officials List.
- Any Federation participating in the event with a team of four (4) or more divers should bring a WA Gold, Silver or bronze level judge or pay a fine of £300.
- World Aquatics shall appoint a WA Technical Delegate for this event. The WA technical delegate shall undertake judging evaluations and shall report their findings back to the WA TDC Commission and the TDC Judges Sub-committee coordinator.























2.2 Dives

Men's Individual Events	3m & 10m	6 dives, no limits
Women's Individual Events	3m & 10m	5 dives, no limits
Men's Synchro events	3m & 10m	2 dives with limit and 4 dives without limit
Women's Synchro events	3m & 10m	2 dives with limit and 3 dives without limit

3. REPLACEMENT OF AN INJURED DIVER

If a diver is unable to compete at the beginning of any final session, the diver ranked next from the preliminary competition shall advance to the final. In case of a tie in the last place of a preliminary session both divers will qualify. The same is valid for any tie on the podium, both divers shall receive a medal.

EXPENSES FOR THE PARTICIPATIONS

The participation fee below includes participation in the competition and athletes accreditation along with hotel, all meals and transportation to and from the airport (Manchester Airport). All hotels are in walking distance from the pool venue.

ACCREDITATION

All competitors, coaches, chaperones and support staff must have a valid accreditation to gain access to athlete areas at the event. Accreditation is nontransferable and must be always worn when accessing athlete areas.

If the pass is forgotten, lost or mislaid, a replacement pass will be re-issued for a fee of £10.00 at the Sport Information Desk.

ATHLETES

Your accreditation will be sent to you by email in PDF format upon completion of your entry.

Please print and bring with you to the event where you can collect a pouch and lanyard from the Sport Information Desk.

If you are unable to find the accreditation link within the confirmation email, you can issue yourself a replacement via the link **HERE**

COACHES, TEAM STAFF, CHAPERONES

All coaches, team staff and, chaperones and must have a valid photo to gain access to the pool deck. Applications for coach/chaperone passes will be charged at £10.

A valid DBS check, safeguarding qualification and fulfilment of the minimum qualification/requirement for the specific role (stated below) you are undertaking is required.

DOPING CONTROL

Doping Control is managed by UKAD. It is their decision as to use the event to test. A doping Control area has been identified poolside in case any doping control tests need to be carried out.

By entering this event you/your child (if athlete is under 18), consents to report to Doping Control if requested at any time during this event. You further agree to be bound by the British Swimming Ant-Doping Rules 2021.























DBS / PVG AND SAFEGUARDING

Swim England

All Swim England clubs and license applicants will have completed a DBS application regardless of any previous check carried out through another organisation unless this has been registered with the DBS Update Service www.gov.uk/dbs-update-service. If you hold a disclosure that has been registered with the DBS Update Service, and you have not yet given the Swim England written consent to check the status, please submit your original disclosure certificate along with a completed consent form to dbs@swimming.org. Please also email dbs@swimming.org for a DBS Update Service Consent form.

Scottish Swimming/Swim Wales

For queries regarding PVG for Scottish Swimming members, please email wellbeingprotection@scottishswimming.com. For queries regarding DBS for Swim Wales members, please email welfare@swimwales.org.

PLEASE NOTE: Scottish Swimming, Swim Wales and International Poolside Passes must be created and sent manually. They will be sent out prior to the event if you have the appropriate Safeguarding checks and qualifications on file.

Minimum Qualification/Requirements (specific to accredited role)

- Coaches Coaching Qualification or Assistant Coach Certificate
- Team Manager Team Manager Training Module 1 or 2 Certificate
- Chaperone Club authorisation to be acting in loco parentis on behalf of the Club

PLEASE NOTE: It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure a DBS is in place and a pass has been purchased to attend the event. Under no circumstances will any person be allowed entry to accredited areas without the relevant safeguarding checks in place and pass issued.

SECURITY / HEALTH AND SAFETY










AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT

VERBAL/WRITTEN

- Remarks of a sexual nature about a person's clothing,

- Coercion of sexual activity by threat of punishment
 Excessive and unwelcome flirting

NON-VERBAL

- Looking a person's body up and down Making derogatory gestures or facial expressions of a sexual nature
- Frequently following or standing too close to a person on
- Whistling or staring in a sexually suggestive or offensive

PHYSICAL

- Impeding or blocking a person's physical movement
- Inappropriate and unwanted touching of a person and/or their clothing
- Other inappropriate touching including kissing, hugging,
- patting, stroking or rubbing Playing music with offensive or degrading language Purposefully brushing up against another person

VISUAL

- Displaying sexually suggestive objects, pictures, cartoons, posters, calendars or computer screens

- Showing other people sexually suggestive text messages or emails Sharing sexually inappropriate images or videos such as pornography

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Aquatics GB are aware of the wide range of devices including mobile telephones which have photographic and filming capabilities. This enables the capture of both static and moving images. It should be acknowledged that the majority of images taken within an Aquatics GB setting are appropriate and taken in good faith. However, images of children and adults can be misused, and sharing images widely without consent may betray a confidence or identify of a child or adult, which could present a risk of harm to that individual if common sense procedures are not followed.

Parents and carers of participants under the age of 18 who wish to take images are requested to focus on their own children as much as reasonably possible and to avoid including other children in images, particularly if those images are being shared with family and friends or through social media platforms. Whilst it is acknowledged that parents/carers wish to celebrate the achievements of their own children when taking part in aquatic events, it should be recognised and respected that other parents/carers may not wish for their child's image to be taken and shared in this way.

Aquatics GB encourage all spectators and participants at Aquatics GB events to make themselves familiar with the photography and filming arrangements for the event and be vigilant during that event.

Aquatics GB is committed to ensuring that all children who participate in Aquatics GB activities can take part in an enjoyable, safe environment and be safeguarded from harm. If you have any child safeguarding concerns at the event, please contact an Event Officer immediately to disclose your concerns.

EVENT PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING

This event will be photographed and live streamed. Static images will be displayed on the Aquatics GB website here. They will be used to promote the sport at this event and events in the future. Moving images may be displayed at the venue and via live stream here. In addition, Aquatics GB may use these recordings and images for the purposes of education and training, swimmer analysis, promotion, performance, development and selection and event analysis.

In such instances where the event is being live streamed, it will not be possible to provide the option to refuse consent to filming and if there are any concerns, please speak to the Event Officer present. However, if individuals wish to refuse consent to static photography, please complete the Photography Refusal of Consent Form below and return to Aquatics GB Events Department.
