

ACCREDITATION

All competitors, coaches, chaperones and support staff must have a valid accreditation to gain access to athlete areas at the event. Accreditation is non-transferable and must always be worn when accessing athlete areas.

If the pass is forgotten, lost or mislaid, a replacement pass will be re-issued for a fee of £10.00 at the Sport Information Desk.

Swim England

All Swim England clubs and license applicants will have completed a DBS application regardless of any previous check carried out through another organisation unless this has been registered with the DBS Update Service www.gov.uk/dbs-update-service. If you hold a disclosure that has been registered with the DBS Update Service, and you have not yet given the Swim England written consent to check the status, please submit your original disclosure certificate along with a completed consent form to dbs@swimming.org. Please also email dbs@swimming.org for a DBS Update Service Consent form.

Scottish Swimming/Swim Wales

For queries regarding PVG for Scottish Swimming members, please email wellbeingprotection@scottishswimming.com. For queries regarding DBS for Swim Wales members, please email welfare@swimwales.org.

PLEASE NOTE: Scottish Swimming, Swim Wales and International Poolside Passes must be created and sent manually. They will be ready to collect at the event if you have the appropriate Safeguarding checks and qualifications on file.

Minimum Qualification/Requirements (specific to accredited role)

- Coaches - Coaching Qualification or Assistant Coach Certificate
- Team Manager – Team Manager Training Module 1 or 2 Certificate
- Chaperone – Club authorisation to be acting in loco parentis on behalf of the Club

PLEASE NOTE: It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure a DBS is in place and a pass has been purchased to attend the event. Under no circumstances will any person be allowed entry to accredited areas without the relevant safeguarding checks in place and pass issued.

DIVE SHEETS

Divers/Coaches are requested to submit dive sheets electronically, both for their own convenience and to minimize the chance of errors loading the data into the Recording program. Coaches may make bulk submission of dive sheets on behalf of their divers by using the program DiveSheets with which they will already be familiar. Alternatively, individual divers may submit their own dive sheets on-line. To submit your dive sheets on-line there are two options:

As soon as you complete either on-line submission method, you will see a success/failure message.

Electronic dive sheets must be submitted. Electronic submissions must be made 9am Wednesday 28th January. You will be asked to sign hard copies of these sheets at the venue, available from the Recorders.

If manual dive sheets need to be submitted, they must be submitted no later than two hours before the technical Meeting.

EVENT CONDITIONS

Event Conditions for AGB Diving International 2026

1. EVENT FORMAT

The AGB Diving International Event will be held in accordance with the World Aquatics Rules which can be found on the WA website
<https://www.worldaquatics.com/rules/competition-regulations>

2. COMPETITION FORMAT

- The AGB Diving International shall be open to all World Aquatics affiliated Federations.
- In the preliminary stage of the individual events there is no limit to the number of entries from any federation.
- The top twelve (12) placed divers from the preliminary round will progress from preliminary to final.
- Only two (2) divers from any federation will be permitted to qualify for the final. Any places in the final, not taken up by top 2 divers per federation will be allocated to the next diver in the rankings from the preliminary round. In the final a maximum of 2 divers per federation will be on the victory podium
- The synchronised competitions will have a direct final. There is no limit on the number of entries from any federation, but only one synchro pair from each federation will be on the victory podium.
- There is no opportunity for exhibition places.

2.1 Judges

- The Event shall be judged by World Aquatics Bronze, Silver or Gold judges on the World Aquatics Diving Officials List.
- Any Federation participating in the event with a team of four (4) or more divers should bring a WA Gold, Silver or bronze level judge or pay a fine of £300.
- World Aquatics shall appoint a WA Technical Delegate for this event. The WA technical delegate shall undertake judging evaluations and shall report their findings back to the WA TDC Commission and the TDC Judges Sub-committee coordinator.

2.2 Dives

Men's Individual Events	3m & 10m	6 dives, no limits
Women's Individual Events	3m & 10m	5 dives, no limits
Men's Synchro events	3m & 10m	2 dives with limit and 4 dives without limit
Women's Synchro events	3m & 10m	2 dives with limit and 3 dives without limit

3. REPLACEMENT OF AN INJURED DIVER

If a diver is unable to compete at the beginning of any final session, the diver ranked next from the preliminary competition shall advance to the final. In case of a tie in the last place of a preliminary session both divers will qualify. The same is valid for any tie on the podium, both divers shall receive a medal.

4. ANTI-DOPING

By entering this event you/your child (if athlete is under 18), consent to report to Doping Control if requested at any time during this event. You further agree to be bound by the [British Swimming Anti-Doping Rules 2021](#).

DOPING CONTROL

If an athlete is subject to doping control, they should ensure they provide detail of all medications (prescribed or over the counter and including dosage) and supplements taken within the last 7 days in advance of the test and (where the sample collected is a blood sample) blood transfusions within the previous three (3) months, on the Doping Control Form. Any previously disclosed medications or supplements to your club and/or your home nation do not form any part of doping control.

If the medication you are taking is prohibited in or out of competition you may require a TUE. Please read the details below.

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)

INTERNATIONAL ATHLETES ONLY (British athletes, please see below)

If you are an international athlete requiring a TUE, please contact either your National Federation, your National Anti-Doping Organisation or World Aquatics.

BRITISH ATHLETES ONLY (International athletes please see above)

If an athlete **IS WITHIN** the National TUE Pool, they are required to obtain a TUE before using a prohibited medication or method. You can check if you are within the National TUE Pool via <https://www.ukad.org.uk/national-tue-pool> and selecting 'aquatics'.

If an athlete is **NOT** within the National TUE Pool but using a prohibited medication or method **and** is subject to doping control they are required to apply for a retroactive TUE. Athletes are encouraged to notify UKAD they wish to apply for a retroactive TUE as soon as possible following doping control (tue@ukad.org.uk)

Strict Liability means an athlete is wholly responsible for any banned substance found in their system, no matter how it got there.

As a safety precaution and in line with best practice, we recommend that if you or your athlete is required to attend doping control, another individual remains on site to accompany you or the athlete to their destination afterwards, to ensure they are not alone.

PARKING

There is limited onsite parking at Ponds Forge, with dedicated disabled spaces on the top level. Ponds Forge operates a ANPR system car park. Tickets can be purchased from the machines located at the entrance to the lift lobbies. Car Park closes when the venue closes.

Event Car Park Information

All event attendees are advised to use the official event car park- Castlegate Q Park (closest to Ponds) or Sheffield Station.

On the day event parking customers will receive a **15%** discount on the published prices by scanning their ticket whilst in Ponds Forge.

MERCHANDISE

MEDICAL

Paramedics and an ambulance will be on site during the competition dates, Friday 30th January – Sunday 1st February. Please note Ponds Forge Staff will be the first responder to all incident's poolside.

It is 2.9 miles away, approximately a 15-minute drive.

SECURITY / HEALTH AND SAFETY

Security staff will be on site at the venue checking all accredited persons at key access points to the venue and the pool and carrying out ticket checks for spectators.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of all staff, volunteers, athletes, and spectators is our top priority. It is essential that every member of the workforce understands their role in maintaining a safe environment and knows how to act in the event of an incident.

Incident Reporting Procedure

All incidents, accidents, or near misses — whether involving workforce members, athletes, or the public — must be reported immediately. This includes:

- Injuries (minor or serious)
- Illnesses
- Unsafe conditions or hazards
- Damage to equipment or infrastructure
- Security concerns or suspicious behaviour

To report an incident:

1. Ensure safety first – If there is immediate danger, alert your Team Leader, venue staff, event organisers or on-site medics.
2. Notify the Event Organisers – provide clear details of the incident.
3. If necessary, complete an Incident Report Form.
4. Follow instructions – Remain available to assist if needed, and do not leave the area unless instructed.
5. If you are ever unsure of how to respond to a situation, speak to the Event Organisers immediately.

Aquatics GB will work with Ponds Forge International Sports Centre to ensure that the venue is safe for all participants and for the competition to take place to World Aquatics Standards adhering to all UK health and safety guidance a full risk assessment of the event will be completed and checked daily.

AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT



Unwanted conduct of a sexual nature which has the purpose or effect of violating an individual's dignity, or creating an intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating or offensive environment.

4 Types of sexual harassment

VERBAL/WRITTEN

- Remarks of a sexual nature about a person's clothing, personal behaviour or body
- Sexually explicit statements, questions, jokes or anecdotes
- Requesting sexual favours or dates
- Spreading rumours about a person's personal life
- Coercion of sexual activity by threat of punishment
- Excessive and unwelcome flirting

PHYSICAL

- Impeding or blocking a person's physical movement
- Inappropriate and unwanted touching of a person and/or their clothing
- Other inappropriate touching including kissing, hugging, patting, stroking or rubbing
- Playing music with offensive or degrading language
- Purposefully brushing up against another person

NON-VERBAL

- Looking a person's body up and down
- Making derogatory gestures or facial expressions of a sexual nature
- Frequently following or standing too close to a person on purpose
- Whistling or staring in a sexually suggestive or offensive manner

VISUAL

- Displaying sexually suggestive objects, pictures, cartoons, posters, calendars or computer screens
- Showing other people sexually suggestive text messages or emails
- Sharing sexually inappropriate images or videos such as pornography

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Aquatics GB are aware of the wide range of devices including mobile telephones which have photographic and filming capabilities. This enables the capture of both static and moving images. It should be acknowledged that the majority of images taken within an Aquatics GB setting are appropriate and taken in good faith. However, images of children and adults can be misused, and sharing images widely without consent may betray a confidence or identify of a child or adult, which could present a risk of harm to that individual if common sense procedures are not followed.

Parents and carers of participants under the age of 18 who wish to take images are requested to focus on their own children as much as reasonably possible and to avoid including other children in images, particularly if those images are being shared with family and friends or through social media platforms. Whilst it is acknowledged that parents/carers wish to celebrate the achievements of their own children when taking part in aquatic events, it should be recognised and respected that other parents/carers may not wish for their child's image to be taken and shared in this way.

Aquatics GB encourage all spectators and participants at Aquatics GB events to make themselves familiar with the photography and filming arrangements for the event and be vigilant during that event.

Aquatics GB is committed to ensuring that all children who participate in Aquatics GB activities can take part in an enjoyable, safe environment and be safeguarded from harm. If you have any child safeguarding concerns at the event, please contact an Event Officer immediately to disclose your concerns.

EVENT PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING
